ORDER 2004

The Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 and 2 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1984) and of all other powers then enabling and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 hereby the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 9th day of January 2004 and may be cited as the "Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council (Bevin Avenue and Traffic Island at Bevin Avenue, Sandfields, Port Talbot)(Revocation) Order 2004.
2. (1) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
(2) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. The provisions contained in Article 5 and Schedule 3 of the Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council (Aberavon Seafront, Port Talbot) (No stopping at any time, except buses) (No stopping at any time, except taxis) and (No Waiting, Loading or Unloading at any time) Order 1999 are hereby revoked insofar as they relate to the sides and lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE


1. Bevin Avenue – South West Side

From a point approximately 122 metres South East of its junction with Dalton Road for a distance of approximately 92 metres in a general Southerly direction.

2. Traffic Island (Roundabout) at Bevin Avenue

Around the South Western side of the traffic island a distance of approximately 76 metres.
