(AMENDMENT NO. 2) ORDER 1991

The Council of the County of West Glamorgan (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2, 32, 36, 45, 46, 53, 54 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

This Order shall come into operation on the 23 day of 1. September 1991 and may be cited as the West Glamorgan County Council (Neath Town Centre) ((Traffic Management) Order 1988) (Amendment No. 2) Order 1991.

In this Order:-

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Regulation 2 of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in Regulation 3(i) of the Disabled Persons (Radges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1922

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a Local Authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for parking discs (B.S. 4631 - 1970) coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, and

"relevant position" means:-

- in the case of a vehicle fitted with a (i)front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of an immediately behind the windscreen;
- (ii)
- in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle.

"public service vehicle" shall have the same meaning as in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981 and "local service" shall have the same meaning as in Section 1 of the Transport Act 1985

(2) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

The provisions of the Orders specified in Schedule 1 to this Order are hereby revoked in so far as they relate to the sides or lengths of road specified in Schedules 2 to 4 to this Order.

Save as provided in Articles 6 and 7 of this Order no person shall, except on the direction of a Police Constable in uniform, or of a Traffic Warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait for longer than 30 minutes or to return within one hour to the same side or length of road on which the period of waiting originally began between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day except Sunday on the sides or lengths of road as set out in Schedule 2 to this Order.

Save as provided in Articles 7 and 8 of this Order no person shall, except on the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait for longer than two hours or to return within two hours to the same side or length of road on which the period of waiting originally began between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day except Sunday on the sides or lengths of road as set out in Schedule 3 to this Order.

Nothing in Article 4 and 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides or lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-

(i) building, industrial or demolition operations;

- (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
- (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
- (f) public service vehicles operating a local service when waiting at an authorised bus stop to set down or pick up passengers, or to school busses.
- Nothing in Article 4 and 5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the side of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding 2 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road).
- Save as provided in Articles 9 and 10 of this Order no person except at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait or to be loaded or unloaded at any time on the sides or lengths of road as set out in Schedule 4 to this Order.
- 9. The Prohibitions imposed by Article 8 of this Order shall not apply to a vehicle when displaying on its windscreen a permit issued by the West Glamorgan County Council exempting the vehicle from the provisions of the said Article.
- 10. The prohibitions imposed by Article 8 of this Order shall not apply to Police, Fire, Ambulance or emergency service vehicles or to Local Authority Vehicles when in pursuance of statutory duties or powers.

Schedule 2

Waiting Limited to 30 minutes return prohibited within 1 hour, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday.

Victoria Gardens (Library Road) - South Side

Between points approximately 20 metres and 36 metres east of its junction with London Road.

<u>Schedule 3</u>

Waiting Limited to 2 Hours, recurs prohibited within 2 Hours, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday.

Croft Road (Northeast Side)

Between points 6 metres and 30 metres northwest of its junction with the Parade.

The Parade (Southeast side)

Between points 37 metres northeast of its junction with Charlisville Place and 20 metres southwest of its junction with the northeast kerbline of Croft Road, a distance of 30 metres approximately.

London Road (East Side)

Between points 10 metres and 55 metres south of its junction with Greenway Road.

London Road (West Side)

Between points 16 metres north of its junction with Alford Road and 80 metres south of its junction with The Ropewalk, a distance of approximately 134 metres.

Schedule 4

Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading At Any Time (Except by Permitted Vehicles)

Croft Road (Southwest Side)

Between points 13 metres and 22 metres southeast of its junction with Zoar Road.

The Panade (West Side)

Between points 10 metres north of its junction with Maes yr Haf and 12 metres south of its junction with Commercial Street, a distance of approximately 24 metres.

Windsor Road (East Side)

Between points 10 metres and an metres south of its junction with Summerfield Place.
