

THE WEST GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL
(YSTALYFERA) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) AND
(WEIGHT RESTRICTION) ORDER 1987

The West Glamorgan County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as the "Act of 1984") and of all other powers them enabling and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 11th day of JANUARY 1988 and may be cited as the "West Glamorgan County Council (Ystalyfera) (Prohibition of Waiting) and (Weight Restriction) Order 1987."
2. (1) In this Order:-
 - "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975;
 - "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;
 - "parking disc" means a disc, issued by a Local Authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for parking Discs (BS. 4631 - 1970), coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, and
 - "relevant position" means:
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen;
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle.
3. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. Save as provided in Article 5 or 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the side or length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
5. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides or lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
 - (f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road.
 - (g) stage carriage vehicles when waiting at an authorised bus stop to set down or pick up passengers.

6. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the side of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding 2 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road).
7. No person shall cause any vehicle, the laden weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes to proceed along the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order except to gain access to premises or land on the said roads.
8. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament.

SCHEDULE 1

7.5 Tonnes Weight Restriction Order (Except for Access) Commercial Street/Church Road.

From the junction of Commercial Street with Old Wern Road to the junction of Church Road with Godre'rgraig By-Pass, Ystalyfera.

SCHEDULE 2

Prohibition of Waiting At Any Time Commercial Street (South Side), Ystalyfera.

From a point opposite the western kerbline of Millborough Road for a distance of 15 metres in an easterly direction.
