THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (SEVENOAKS ROAD, IGHTHAM)
(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1984

The Kent County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and by Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait:-

- (a) in the length of road specified in the First Schedule to this Order; or
- (b) between the hours of 7.00 a.m. and 7.00 p.m. daily in the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this Order;
 - (i) for a longer period than 2 hours; or
 - (ii) if a period of less than 4 hours has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle in that length of road.

2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in either of the lengths of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:-

- (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose elsewhere, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the carrying out of any roadworks or the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports; or
- (d) to enable the vehicle to be used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.

3. (1) Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the length of road referred to in the First Schedule to this Order for a period not exceeding 2 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).

(2) Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge to wait in the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.

4. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1967, or by or under any other enactment.

5. In this Order:-

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631: 1970), coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"relevant position" means:-

- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the Eighth day of August 1984 and may be cited as "The Kent County Council (Sevenoaks Road, Ightham) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1984".

FIRST SCHEDULE
(Waiting Prohibited at all times)

Length of Road in the Parish of Ightham

Sevenoaks Road (A.25) on the north-west side between points 22 metres north-east and 230 metres south-west of the centre of the junction with Rectory Lane, including the layby situated on the north-west side of the main carriageway of the said length of Sevenoaks Road except the length of that layby specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.

SECOND SCHEDULE
(Waiting Limited to 2 hours in 6 between 7.00 a.m. and 7.00 p.m. daily)

Length of Road in the Parish of Ightham

That length of the layby situated on the north-west side of the main carriageway of the length of Sevenoaks Road (A.25) specified in the First Schedule to this Order which extends from a point 3 metres north-east of the centre of the access to the property known as "Tanglewood" for a distance of 63 metres in a north-easterly direction to a point 58 metres south-west of the centre of the junction with Rectory Lane.
