THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, TONBRIDGE AND MALLING) (VARIATION OF TONBRIDGE AND MALLING BOROUGH 1986 CONSOLIDATED TRAFFIC ORDER) (VARIATION NO.42A) ORDER 1998

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, 3, 124 and Part IV of schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other powers them enabling and after consultation with the Police pursuant to Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 do hereby make the following Order:

- 1. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament.
- 2. In this Order the expression "Order of 1986" means "The Borough of Tonbridge and Malling (Consolidation of Traffic Orders) (Various Roads, Tonbridge and Malling) Order 1986"
- 3. Except where the context otherwise admits any reference to a schedule is a reference to a Schedule to this order.
- 4. The Order of 1986 is hereby varied by the addition of the following after Part K:

Part L One Way Systems

No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle other than a mechanical road cleansing vehicle or a pedal cycle in a cycle lane to proceed in the road or length of road specified any item in column 1 of Schedule 9 otherwise than in the direction specified in column 2 of the corresponding item in Schedule 9.

- 5. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 as aforesaid or by any other enactments.
- This Order shall come into operation upon its making and shall be cited as "The Kent County Council (Various Roads, Tonbridge and Malling) (Variation of Tonbridge and Malling Borough 1986 Consolidated Traffic Order) (Variation No. 42A) Order 1998".
